METHODOLGY



1,219 Alberta residents were surveyed between May 12 – May 14, 2023.

We used the *Lucid Exchange Platform* as the sample provider, which blends a variety of partner panels.

If the survey was a probability-based random sample of the same size, it would be considered accurate to +/-3% nineteen times out of twenty.

Results are weighted for:

• Age, gender and region according to the most recent Census.


Topline Findings

- More than 8 in 10 Albertans are worry that their standard of living may decline because of inflation.
- A large majority of Albertans express concern over being able to afford their household expenses – most notably groceries (82%) and utilities (78%).
- 6 in 10 Albertans support raising the minimum wage, while one in three believe the minimum wage of \$15/hour should be kept status quo.
- 7 in 10 believe minimum wage should be kept current with the rate of inflation.
- More than 6 in 10 who are working full- or part-time believe their salaries or wages have not kept up with inflation.










CONSUMER CONCERN - GROCERIES






CONSUMER CONCERN - UTILITIES






CONSUMER CONCERN - GASOLINE/FUEL






CONSUMER CONCERN – AUTO INSURANCE











MINIMUM WAGE PINNED TO INFLATION






